Logic 1 (Informal Logic): 1 Credit

The aim of this course is equip young minds to think critically in the commercial, political, and social world in which we live. The authors of the textbook that we have chosen explain and illustrate twenty-eight informal fallacies which are frequently encountered in the media and conversation. The emphasis on practical

application will help students to remember and apply these lessons long after the course is completed. The reward will be an improved ability to evaluate arguments and reason well. This course is organized in our new daily lesson schedule format.



Logic 2 (Formal Logic): 1 Credit

This course will introduce students to the interesting realm of formal, deductive logic. Coming after a study of informal logic, which concerns the claims being made in the *content* of an argument, a study of formal logic analyzes the *structure* of the argument. Logic as a subject is perfect for training young minds to think clearly, and is best taught by showing the relevance of

Persuasive Writing and Speech: 1 Credit

In the art of persuasion, the classical trivium comes into its own, as grammar, logic and rhetoric harmonize in the achievement of a winning argument. In this course, students will be able to put to use all the logic and writing skills learned up to now plus some new ideas that will enrich their writing and speaking. A dozen different techniques of classical rhetoric will be explained and practiced. Students will be asked to read and recognize the techniques being used by other authors, practice them in short paragraph assignments, and eventually put the tools to use in one essay and two short speeches. We are confident that the benefit of this course will be seen not only in persuasive discourse but in all other fields of writing and speaking. This course is organized in our new daily lesson schedule format.

Advanced English Composition: 1 Credit (English or Rhetoric)

The Writer's Workshop takes an approach to teaching writing that is new only because it is so old. Today, rhetoric and composition typically proceed by ignoring what was done for 2500 years in Western education. Gregory Roper, on the other hand, helps students learn to write in the way the great writers of the past learned: by carefully imitating masters of the craft, including Cicero, Thomas Aquinas, Charles Dickens, Sojourner Truth, James Joyce, and Ernest Hemingway. By living in their workshops and imitating these and other masters, apprentice writers – like apprentice musicians, painters, and blacksmiths of the past – will rapidly improve the

complexity of their art and discover their own native voices. This course is different from any other offered by *Tree of Life*. Students will be assigned a tutor and enrolled in a small peer group (maximum of 8 students) where writing will be shared (via e-mail), critiqued, and celebrated. This is an ideal opportunity for students in their last two

years of secondary school to develop advanced composition techniques.
